

Recycling Services


Take advantage of the County's convenient **blue bin recycling program** in the unincorporated areas of Santa Barbara County.



YES! RECYCLE PUT THESE ITEMS IN THE BLUE RECYCLE BIN

- **Aluminum** foil and pie plates (balled up or folded is best)
- Empty **cans of all types** (aluminum, steel, tin, bimetal and empty aerosol cans)
- **Glass**
- **Paper** (includes books, paper bags, newspaper, any glossy or non-glossy paper such as office paper, magazines and junk mail; no waxed or laminated paper)
- **Cardboard** and paperboard (e.g. cereal and tissue boxes)
- **Plastics #1-7** (rigid plastics and rigid containers; no bags or film plastic.) Find out more about plastics on page 22.
- **Metals**, pots and pans (e.g. aluminum, copper, or steel)
- **Cartons** (refrigerated milk and juice, Tetrapak and aseptic containers, such as soy milk containers, and boxed soup containers)

TIP: rinse residue from glass, metal, and plastic containers. Metal lids should be removed from glass jars, and caps from plastic containers.



NO! KEEP OUT DO NOT PUT THESE ITEMS IN THE BLUE RECYCLE BIN

- Aerosol cans (full or partially full). See page 23-25 to learn how to recycle.
- Automotive fluids. See page 23-25 to learn how to recycle.
- Batteries. See page 35-38 to learn how to recycle.

Trash

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Compost what you can; put the remaining waste in your trash.



Landfill

The non-recyclable materials are hauled to a landfill, where they are covered daily in a system of compacted layers.



Items Requiring Special handling:



Household Batteries

Residential customers in the unincorporated areas of the County may also have household batteries collected curbside for recycling. The household batteries should be placed in a clear plastic bag and **placed on top** of the blue recycling container on collection day. Visit page 35-38 for complete information.



Sharps

Single-family households in the unincorporated areas of the County may contact their local waste hauler to request a container for the collection of used sharps (needles). Visit page 28-29 for complete information.



Green Waste

Containers for green waste are provided by your hauler, and are serviced at your curbside. Green waste consists of leaves, grass clippings, and other yard trimmings and plant material. Materials are then processed into mulch for beneficial reuse. Visit page 11 for complete information.

Remember, your hand is the last hand to touch what you throw "away".

SOUTH COAST

MarBorg Industries Construction & Demolition (C&D) Debris Facility Consolidates and sorts recyclable materials brought in by waste collection services, as well as contractors and residents. Visit page 14 for complete information.

South Coast Recycling and Transfer Station

A County-operated facility that serves as a **convenient collection point** for non-hazardous waste generated on the South Coast. Home to a recycling center that processes approximately 200 tons per day of recyclable materials. Visit page 14 for complete information.

Tajiguas Landfill

A County-operated facility that serves the unincorporated areas of the County, including the Santa Ynez and New Cuyama Valleys, and the Cities of Buellton, Goleta, Santa Barbara, and Solvang, and buries up to **1,500 tons of trash per day**. Closed to the public without service accounts. Self hauled waste can be taken to the South Coast Recycling and Transfer Station.

Food Forward — Reduce Your Food Print

In America, an astonishing **40% of our food** is landfilled. This waste is generated at each step of the way: at the farm, the store, and at the consumer level.

In Santa Barbara County, 20% of what is landfilled is food.



Source Reduction Tips:



- Inventory and use what you have before you buy more.
- Prepare a shopping list.
- Be creative by using all edible parts of foods (e.g. make stock for soups and sauces, sauté beet tops, make croutons from stale bread, etc.).



- Freeze, preserve or can surplus fruits and vegetables.
- Know how much food you're actually wasting by measuring your waste.
- Reduce plate waste. Start with a small serving.



The County of Santa Barbara's program collects food scraps and transports the material to a local site where it will be processed into compost for agriculture:







The County of Santa Barbara's 'Natural Mulch' is an ideal mulching product that is manufactured from **100% local recycled materials**. Using mulch in your garden **saves water** and completes the local green waste recycling loop.



NATURAL MULCH BENEFITS

- Conserves moisture in the soil
- Moderates soil temperature
- Blocks weed growth
- Reduces erosion
- Improves soil structure and fertility over time

How to get mulch:

Small amounts—

“Load your own” free pile at the South Coast Recycling and Transfer Station

Large amounts—

Can be delivered for as little as \$10/ton* or can be loaded into trucks at the following two locations for a small fee:

NO Palm fronds, pampas grass, food, animal waste, plastic bags, nursery pots, dirt, rocks or smelly socks!

Businesses, apartments and condominiums are **required to recycle waste materials**. There are two options for recycling: **1) take recyclables yourself to a collection facility, or 2) arrange for recycling collection services.**

Multi-Family Complexes

Recycling is included as part of trash collection in most of Santa Barbara County, and does not cost extra. If you live in a multi-family dwelling and do not have access to recycling, check with your hauler to find out what is available.



Businesses

Recycling is priced less than trash service for businesses, and can save companies money on waste disposal. County staff can help businesses in the unincorporated areas manage waste more effectively.

More Help for Businesses

Recycling Market Development Zone (RMZD) Program

The California Refund Value (CRV) is the amount paid to consumers when they recycle beverage containers at certified recycling centers. The minimum refund value established for each type of eligible beverage container is 5 cents for each container under 24 ounces and 10 cents for each container 24 ounces or greater. **The Pink code represents centers that will pay this to consumers.*







What is downcycling?

Plastics lose quality when they are melted into new plastic products. Many plastics are only recyclable into new products one time.




EXAMPLE: Soda bottles end up as lower quality items like fleece and house siding. These products can never be recycled into soda bottles again.



Hazardous Waste

Hazardous waste must be disposed of properly. Hazardous waste pertains to products that contain chemicals that are **flammable, corrosive, reactive, or poisonous.**



Transportation

Caution should be taken when transporting hazardous waste to a collection facility.

If possible, use the original product container or clearly label the container. Cover all containers with a secure fitting lid and pack containers upright in a leak-proof box. You may be asked to provide a detailed inventory, if you have complex chemicals or laboratory waste.

- **Household limit: 15 gallons**
- **Business limit: 27 gallons**

Hazardous Waste Disposal Sites:

Important Asbestos Information

Asbestos can pose a threat to human health when microscopic fibers become airborne and are inhaled.

Asbestos is most commonly found in pre-1980 construction: “popcorn” ceilings, pipe insulation, floor tile and mastic, roofing and fireproofing materials, and textured paints. Never dust, sweep, or vacuum these items or other products suspected of containing asbestos fibers.

Guidelines for Safe Disposal Bags

- ✓ double bagged
- ✓ six millimeters thick
- ✓ specially marked bags indicating contents
- ✓ sealed (twist tied and folded over, and then sealed with duct tape)
- ✓ 25 pounds or less each (max 5 per trip)
- ✓ no holes or tears



If you have large quantities of non-friable asbestos (i.e. unable to be crumbled by hand pressure) in excess of 125 pounds, please call (805) 681-4345 to obtain a permit application and further instructions.





Pharmaceutical Waste (Medications)



NO! Traditionally, consumers have thrown unwanted medicines or pharmaceutical waste into their trash containers, have poured them down their sinks, or have flushed them down their toilets.



YES! The best option for households to dispose of their pharmaceuticals is to take them to an approved drop-off facility.



The details: Pill medications may be dropped off without the bottle, while liquid medications should be kept in the container. Please note that if a medication is a “**controlled substance**”, it can only be taken to one of the Sheriff’s substations.

Hazardous waste collection facilities are not legally permitted to accept controlled substances.

What are controlled substances?

Medications such as narcotics or tranquilizers that may be habit-forming or have the potential for abuse. Common examples include Codeine, Valium, Ritalin, and anabolic steroids. Go to www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov/schedules for more information.

Key Terms

ABOP is an acronym for **A**ntifreeze, **B**atteries, **O**il, and **L**atex **P**aint. An ABOP center is a facility that only accepts these types of household hazardous waste and oil filters.

Aseptic Packaging refers to products containing a mix of paper (70%), plastic (24%), and aluminum (6%). Commonly used for soup and juice products. They are currently recyclable in the curbside collection container for most communities in the southern portion of the County.

Biodegradable refers to a product that can be broken down by bacteria and returned to the natural environment.

Buyback Centers are facilities that will buy or accept for free certain common recyclable materials.

Certified Redemption Centers are located at many supermarkets and accept recyclable glass, plastic, and aluminum beverage containers marked with California Redemption Value (CRV). Each machine accepts a single commodity, refunding the current CRV.

Close the Loop When a consumer buys a product that contains recycled-content, after it has been put into a recycling program and reprocessed into a new item.

Compost is the product resulting from the controlled decomposition of organic debris and used as a soil amendment. Materials that can be composted include: leaves, grass clippings, fruit and vegetable

trimmings, and other organic materials commonly found in municipal waste.

Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D) is material generated during construction or demolition activities that is mostly recyclable. Common materials include concrete, drywall, and wood.

Curbside Collection is the process whereby waste materials are collected curbside for eventual disposal or processing.

Electronic Waste (E-waste) is an item that either plugs in or contains batteries, and should NOT be thrown in the trash.

Grass Cycling is when grass clippings are left on the lawn when mowing, returning valuable nutrients to the soil.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) does NOT belong in the trash as it is flammable, corrosive, reactive, and/or poisonous. Examples of HHW include paint, motor oil, cleaning products, and insecticides.

Landfill is a place to dispose of municipal solid waste by burying it in a series of compacted layers, alternating dirt and waste up to a permitted amount.

Mulch is a soil covering made of organic materials such as yard trimmings and is commonly placed around plants to retain soil moisture, control weeds, prevent erosion, help maintain even soil temperature and enrich the soil.

Recyclable means that a given material can be processed into a new product.

Recycled-Content is the portion of a product's or package's weight that is composed of materials that have been recovered from waste; this may include pre-consumer or post-consumer materials.

Source Reduction is the design, manufacture, purchase or use of materials and products to reduce the amount or toxicity of what is eventually thrown away.

Transfer Station is a facility where trash and recyclables are unloaded from collection vehicles and then subsequently reloaded onto larger long-distance transport vehicles for shipment to landfills, recycling facilities, or other treatment or disposal facilities.

Universal Waste refers to hazardous waste that is generated by a large percentage of the population and should NOT go in the trash. Examples include: batteries, thermostats, fluorescent bulbs, cathode ray tubes, electronic devices, and non-empty aerosol cans.

Vermicomposting is the process whereby worms feed on slowly decomposing materials (vegetable and fruit scraps) in a controlled environment to produce a nutrient-rich soil amendment. This is the ideal way to produce high quality compost indoors.
